“ I first met Mr. George Vaughn when I stopped by my current home, which is next door to his, to check on somethings because we had decided to purchase it. I was sitting in the car, waiting for my husband to come out from checking on the work that was being done, and Mr. George, which is what I called him, tapped on my car window, My head was turned so he startled me. I noticed that it was an elderly gentleman, so I rolled down my window and he said, “Are you going to buy this house”, and I said “Yes, and then he introduced himself as the next door neighbor. He engaged me in conversation for a while, of course getting as much information as he could glean, and then left. After he left, and my husband returned to the car, I said to him, we want have to worry about the safety of our home, becasue we have a nosy neighbor that will keep an eye out for it. Mr. George knew all the cars on the block, and if there was a strange one, he would call to get it towed. He did that to My then friend and now hussband’s car, who had it stored, in front of Mr. George’s house for what he thought was too long. We searched and searched and finally found it in the pound. I am so thankful that God permitted me to know a man like Mr. George. He was kind, but yet frank. He kept you on your toes. He always teased me and several other ladies that we were his girlfriends, and it was an ongoing joke between he, myself and his wife. My husband also was a part of the joke. The biggest joke was that he told me and the other ladies to that it cost us at \$500 a week to be his girlfriend. That was the joke until he died.

The other great memory I have of Mr. George is that he was my biggest supporter. For every campaign, he would always ask me for flyers. He would then staple it to every flower order that left Mary’s Floral Creations. Mary and George provided me with all of the flowers I needed for any event. I wanted to support their business becasue they always supported me.
